RAW MATERIALS NEEDED

- Banana stems (pseudo-stems collected after banana harvest)
- Simple packing materials for shipping and storing

These stems are easy to find and usually don't cost much because farmers throw them away.

HOW TO START A BUSINESS MAKING BANANA FIBER

You don't need a lot of money to start this profession, but you do need to plan carefully. Follow these steps.

Step 1: Do some research on the customers and the demand in your area, such as textile units, handicraft makers, and exporters. Make sure that you want to sell unprocessed banana fiber or finished products. Determine your budget and capacity, in terms of small-scale or medium-scale.

Step 2: Find places that grow bananas and work with farmers there. Make sure you always have stems and sign deals or contracts. Make sure that the way stems are transported and stored is always the same.

Step 3: You can pick between manual, semi-automatic, or automatic extraction tools based on your needs. Information is given in the next part.

Step 4: Use tools to get the fiber out of the stems of bananas. For better strength and shine, wash, dry, and treat the fabric. Sort the fiber into fine or medium grades based on what it will be used for.

Step 5: Contact local textile mills, handicraft groups, rope makers, or exporters. Make a small line of finished goods, like bags, mats, and home decor items, to show off at trade shows or displays. Apply e-commerce sites and digital platforms to connect with environmentally conscious consumers.

Step 6: Start out small, get to know your customers, and then grow as demand grows. Once you have a steady supply and production, you might want to look into export licenses.

HOW TO USE THE MACHINES TO GET BANANA FIBERS

Fiber Extractors

Suitable for small businesses; affordable initial cost, but requires a lot of work.

Semi-Automatic Decorticators

It balances cost and efficiency well and is popular with medium-sized businesses.

Automatic Extraction Machines

These have a bigger capacity and are suitable for industrial units. These can quickly cut through many stems with little work.

Drying Units & Treatment Tanks

Drying Units and Treatment Tanks enhance the quality and durability of fibers.

AREA, MANPOWER, AND INVESTMENT

- **Space Required:** Around 3,500 – 4,000 sq. ft. (for production and storage)
- **Manpower:** 7 – 9 workers (including machine operators and helpers)
- **Electricity Load:** 6 – 8 kW (depending on machine type)
- **Investment:** ₹12 – 15 lakhs for a small to medium-scale setup

BY-PRODUCTS AND EXTRA INCOME

Banana fiber extraction also produces pulp, which can be processed into–

1. **Organic compost for farming**
2. **Liquid pesticides for crops**

This not only reduces waste but creates additional revenue streams.

SUPPORT AND SUBSIDIES FROM THE GOVERNMENT

You can use the PMEGP (Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme) scheme to get the money you need to start this business.

- **Service sector projects:** Assistance up to ₹20 lakhs
- **Manufacturing sector projects:** Assistance up to ₹50 lakhs
- There are also subsidies for SC/ST, OBC, women, and businesses with disabilities.

These kinds of schemes can help you set up your unit more easily and for less money.

HOW TO BE SUCCESSFUL

- Make things on a small scale first before making them on a large scale.
- Make connections with shippers and handicraft groups to make sure you have steady sales. An excellent attention to quality; clean, well-graded fiber sells for more.
- Creative products like bags, mats, and home decor that are good for the environment sell well everywhere.
